It was agreed that when the new residents parking permits are issued, they would be worded so they do not allow any overnight parking of camper vans.
 - v)** Thornley Village Verge Conditions – Cllr Savory reported that the Clean & Green team have been and completed a temporary fix. Cllr Rodgers explained that this repair has already been damaged and it would need to be looked at again.
- 7) CORRESPONDENCE:**
 - i)** Wolsingham Wayfarer's – Car Parking Charges – The Wayfarer's would like the Council to consider a parking permit scheme for walkers. This would be operated

by the Wayfarer's with all monies to go to the Parish Council, the suggestion was £10 a year for the use of the Demesne Mill car park every Saturday, to help encourage walkers to use the car park instead of the side streets. Cllr Rodgers suggested a plan be worked up by the Wayfarer's and the Clerk which would be brought to a future meeting for discussion.

- ii) North East war Memorials Project – This request was for funding to help continue the work of the society. It was agreed to defer any decision until more information could be sought.
- iii) Camper Van Parking – Heather Curzon – as discussed previously.
- iv) DCC – Proposed Diversion of Footpath No.80 Middle Fawnlees – Councillors agreed to offer no comments and the Wayfarers representative at the meeting agreed in principle with the diversion.

8) MAINTENANCE WORKS:

- a) St Anne's Hall – It was agreed to upgrade the lighting to LED for energy efficiency. The new main door has been ordered. Quotes have been requested for the roof lights to be replaced with Velux windows and for insulation to be placed in the roof space.
- b) Recreation Ground – The Clerk had received messages regarding the use of remote-controlled vehicles being misused and off road bikes riding on the playing field. Could these firstly be reported to the Police by telephoning 101, as the Parish Council email & phone are not monitored 24/7. Cllr Bonar reported bikes have been seen riding irresponsibly.
- c) Town Hall – Nothing to report.
- d) Demesne Mill – Works to tidy & clear the car park will be completed on 23rd March, the car park will be closed to all vehicles from 9.30am to 3pm.
- e) Thornley Woods – An incident of fly tipping has been reported to DCC.
- f) Allotments – The new contracts will be sent out shortly by the Clerk with the new annual rent being £50 per allotment. The issue of vermin on the allotments was raised, the Clerk explained that as not all of the allotment holders were in agreement of the type of pest control, no further measures could take place.
- g) Angate Street Toilets – Quotes are being sort for the roof repairs.
